- Backpacks are necessary for kindergarten and school-age children ONLY. We do not have room for preschoolers to have extra items.
- If your child is transported. PLEASE call us and tell us if there is a daily cancellation. If we know in advance there are days when transportation is not necessary.



The Coming of Winter

It hard to tell what the weather is going to do from day to day. We love being outdoors but we want the children to be wrapped up for the weather. Here are just a few reminders for the approaching season.

Please be sure and send your child with

warm clothes on a daily basis. We go outside everyday. If your child is at the Ark, he/she will go out too. We feel strongly that the fresh air and sunshine are as important to the children as the structured preschool program. If you want your child to stay indoors, he/she will need to be kept at home. Asthmatic children are the only exception to this policy. Be sure your child's name is on all of his/her re-



movable garments.

Right along with the cold weather comes the cold and flu season. Our policy is to send a child home if he/she has a temperature of 100 or higher. We do not restrict a child with sniffles or a slight runny nose but if they are very congested,

warm and having trouble participating with the children we will call you. Please do not medicate your child in the A.M. and send him/her to school. The only way we will all stay well is if we work to reduce the germ level. . It is important also to not expose each other unnecessarily. For <u>illnesses, 24 hours at home and</u> medication does the trick. For the Dress for the weather Norovirus, 72 hours after symptoms subside.

Extra Days

The children are always welcome to come to the Ark for extra time. Please give us a call the night before or in the A.M. to let us know and then please give us a reminder when you come into the Ark. This way we will be sure to let everyone know that we have an extra little friend with us for the day. If for some reason you have a change in your child's schedule for the day, always take the time to talk to the person at the desk. We don't always see it if it is just written on the sign -in sheets. Thank you

PRO CARE is coming!

Starting the first of the year (hopefully) we will have a whole new check in and accounting system which is guaranteed to make your life easier. Check in/out will be by fingerprint recognition and payments will be able to be made at our front monitor, in the office or the privacy of your home online. We will be asking for security papers to be completed and we will be giving everyone a code for registering at the desk. It will track the children's' immunizations and physicals and notations to parents will be on the check-in computer. It's a process! Stay tuned!
