
# Around the Ark

# What Happens at the Ark When it Snows?



It is hard to be thinking about snow when the leaves are still falling off of the trees and we've only just begun to wear our warm clothes, but, you never know. This is Nevada!

In the event of snow, here are our protocols:

-If the Washoe County schools have a delayed start, Noah's Ark will open at our regular time of 7:00am. School-age children are welcome to come on these delayed start days and we will make sure they get to school at the later time.

-When Washoe County schools close due to snow, Noah's Ark is also closed. Radio stations and TV stations are notified around 6:00am to make the announcement for the Ark. Parents will also be notified by Sentext. Reminder, tuition is still charged for snow days.

-If we have snow and the Washoe County schools are on normally scheduled times, make sure to bundle your little up, so they're ready to play in the snow!
